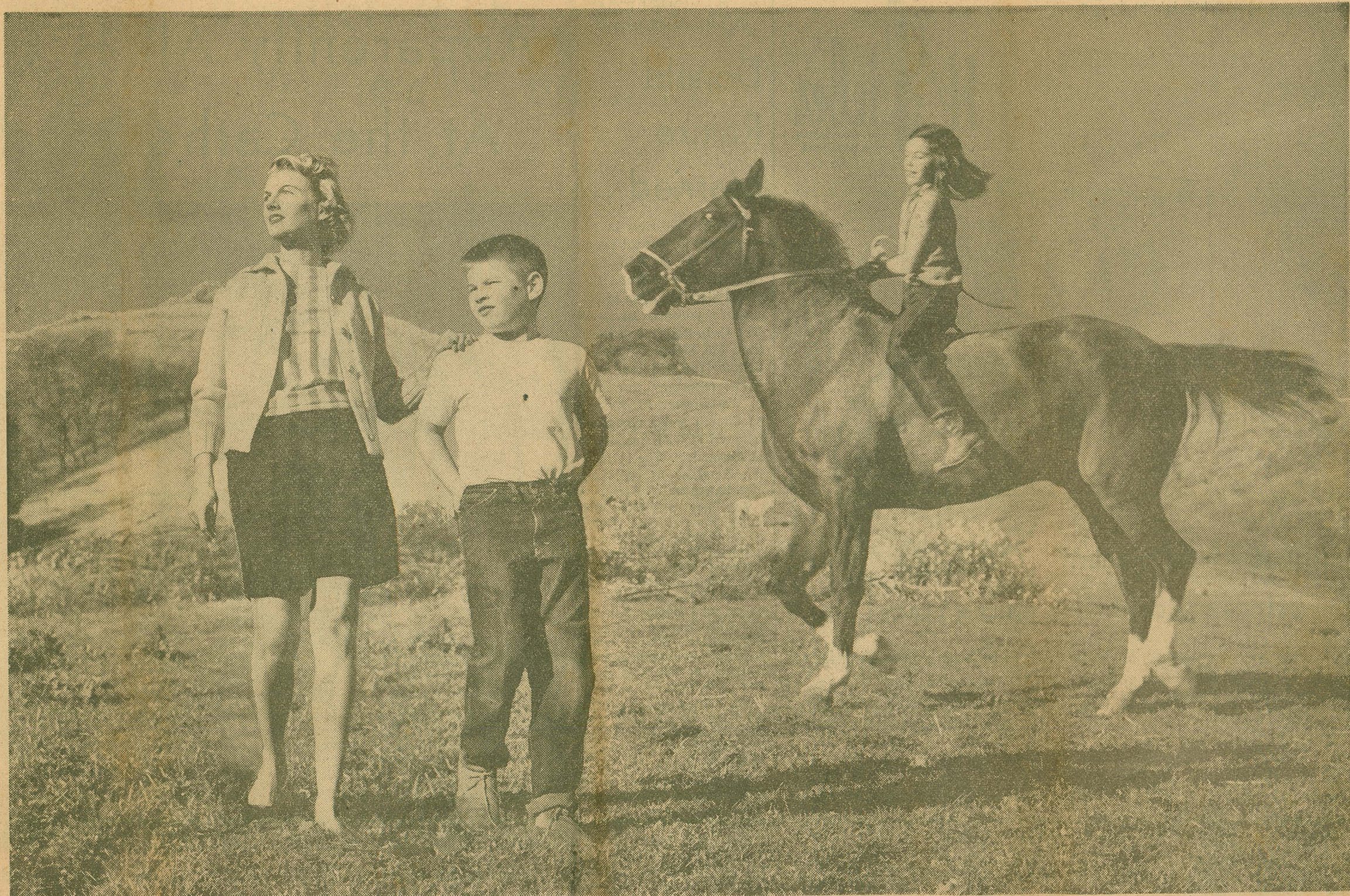


# THE DOUBLE LIFE OF MRS. JACKSON
